HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK? ▶

If you enjoy caring for children and want a first-hand experience of family life in another culture, our Au Pair Abroad program is for you. By working with in-country agencies, we connect you to qualified host families.

WHAT'S THE ROLE OF AN AU PAIR? ▶

As an au pair, you'll provide child care for your host family's children. Your duties may include taking the children to school and picking them up, playing with them and taking them to activities, preparing their meals and helping them with homework.

WHAT WILL I EARN? ▶

Stipends vary by country

All au pairs receive:

- ▶ Private room and board
- ▶ A weekly or monthly stipend

Other benefits may include:

- ▶ Travel and cultural opportunities
- ▶ Language classes
- ▶ Paid time off
- ▶ Health care coverage
- ▶ International Student & Youth Exchange (ISE) Card

HOW LONG CAN I STAY? ▶

Most au pair placements last 9 to 12 months and begin in September. We also have a limited number of 6-month and summer positions that start in May.
