


# The I-94 Admission Record

If you are entering the U.S. by air or sea, United States Customs and Border Protection (CBP) will record your arrival electronically. We recommend that you access and print your electronic admission record (I-94 record) by visiting [www.cbp.gov/i94](http://www.cbp.gov/i94) and entering the required information as it appears on the travel document you used to enter the United States.
