About InterExchange

InterExchange is a leading 501(c)(3) nonprofit cultural exchange organization based in New York City. Inspired by the Fulbright–Hays Act of 1961, InterExchange has spent nearly 60 years advancing people-to-people diplomacy and global understanding. Our mission—to promote cross-cultural awareness and mutual understanding through international work, teaching, and volunteer exchange programs—guides every aspect of what we do.

As a U.S. Department of State-designated BridgeUSA program sponsor, our inbound BridgeUSA programs for international visitors coming to the U.S. on J-1 non-immigrant visas for temporary cultural exchange include: **Au Pair USA, Camp USA, Career Training USA, and Work & Travel USA**. We also facilitate meaningful exchange programs for Americans going abroad,

including: **Work and Travel, Group Adventure Tours, Language Immersion, and Internships**.

Through our **Christianson Fellowship**, the InterExchange Foundation provides funding to poised young Americans with a passion for improving the world through extended volunteer service abroad. Our newly-launched American Summer Exchange Crossroads Grant will provide funding to highly motivated young Americans who are ready to embark on an exchange adventure within the United States during their summer break.

We are proud to have facilitated transformative exchange experiences for 14,000+ international visitors and American participants in 2025, enriching their lives as well as those of their host families, host businesses, and the broader communities in which they lived and worked.

Public Diplomacy & Cultural Exchange

We facilitate meaningful cultural exchange to advance U.S. foreign policy and public diplomacy.

86%

of our inbound program participants reported that their views of the American people have become much more or somewhat more favorable as a result of their exchange experience in the United States.

98%

of our inbound program participants reported that their program experience offered them opportunities for making cultural connections and sharing their own culture, through activities such as conversations with Americans and the attendance of cultural events.

At the core of our work is a clear and enduring mission: to expand access to international experiences, strengthen cultural literacy, and promote cross-cultural understanding. These principles define who we are and support America's role in an interconnected world. International educational and cultural exchanges directly advance U.S. public diplomacy by showcasing American values, fostering goodwill, and building trusted, long-term relationships that support U.S. political, security, and economic interests.

Our inbound programs bring future leaders to the United States—people who will shape their countries' political, economic, and social futures. These early connections build bridges that last decades. We believe an exchange experience is most powerful at the community level. Through our nationwide network of host families, host camps, and host employers, we facilitate thousands of daily interactions in homes,

workplaces, and neighborhoods across rural and urban America. These encounters challenge assumptions, expand cultural awareness, and create personal connections that benefit both international participants and the Americans who welcome and work alongside them.

Our outbound participants serve as informal ambassadors of the United States as they travel abroad—challenging stereotypes, exemplifying American values, and building global networks rooted in shared experience and trust. In turn, they return home with broadened perspectives and deeper empathy for other cultures, enriching their communities and elevating cultural discourse in the United States.

Nearly six decades of facilitated exchanges have resulted in a strong, engaged global alumni network. InterExchange alumni continue to advance the values of cultural exchange and cooperation by mentoring new participants,

strengthening international partnerships, and sharing informed, experience-based perspectives within their communities. As credible, firsthand voices, our international alumni share nuanced understandings of American society, values, and people. They counter misconceptions and sustain people-to-people connections long after their exchange experiences end.

Together, the experiences InterExchange is privileged to facilitate form a powerful mosaic of people-to-people diplomacy—one that strengthens communities, advances U.S. interests, and lays the groundwork for a more peaceful, cooperative global future. This is where bridges get built—not in conference rooms, but in

the living rooms, camp cabins, and break rooms across America and around the world.

Support for U.S. Communities

We bring critical resources to American citizens, businesses and communities across the U.S.

In 2025, we placed program participants with **3,800+ U.S. host families, camps, and businesses** in **47 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands.**

Our Work and Travel USA participants played a critical role in helping U.S. communities across the country address the nationwide lifeguard shortage, ensuring pools, beaches, and waterfronts could remain open and safe for American families.

Our international participants brought essential skills and cultural diversity to communities across 47 U.S. states, Washington DC, Guam, and the Northern Mariana Islands—supporting host families, businesses, and seasonal employers in both rural and urban areas. While our exchange participants are given the life-changing opportunity to fully immerse themselves in American culture, their own contributions enrich American workplaces and communities, reinforce economic stability, bolster the capacity of American families to navigate busy lives, and enable American businesses to provide high-quality services during peak seasons.

Supporting Special Needs Camps

In 2025, InterExchange placed international camp counselors at 32 summer camps in 15 U.S. states that serve campers with diverse needs. These counselors are highly motivated, passionate, and often experienced in caregiving or education, bringing cultural sensitivity, adaptability, and global perspectives to inclusive camp environments. Their global backgrounds

foster empathy, patience, and creative problem-solving—qualities essential when supporting campers with varying abilities—while also promoting cultural awareness and social growth among campers and staff. Together, their contributions enrich camp communities and strengthen inclusive programming across the country.

Door County Partnership

For more than 15 years, InterExchange has partnered with Door County, Wisconsin, placing exchange visitors from around the world with seasonal employers across the region—including hotels, restaurants, parks, and cultural attractions. With a year-round population of approximately 30,000 and more than 2 million visitors annually, Door County relies heavily on seasonal labor, particularly as many local residents are retired and no longer able to fill peak-season positions. Through the Work & Travel USA program, InterExchange helps sustain Door County's seasonal economy and preserve the vitality of its tourism-driven communities. Exchange visitors enable businesses—many of them small and locally owned—to meet peak demand and deliver high-quality service to visitors. At the same time, participants enrich the region's cultural fabric by bringing young people from countries such as Albania, Romania, Turkey, Colombia, and Ukraine, who share their traditions, perspectives, and skills with residents and visitors alike. These daily interactions foster meaningful cross-cultural understanding in a small, rural American community.

Global Skills Development

We provide our participants the opportunity to develop indispensable global competency and workforce skills.

96%

of our program participants reported that they increased their personal and/or professional skills as a result of their participation in our exchange programs.

Our exchange programs equip young leaders from around the world with the professional, linguistic, and intercultural skills essential in today's global economy. Through immersive experiences, participants gain practical work experience, strengthen communication, adaptability, and cross-cultural competence, and deepen their understanding of life and work in the U.S. or their host country abroad. These life-changing programs foster personal growth, expand global awareness, and prepare both American and international participants to excel in their careers and become effective, culturally fluent problem-solvers in an interconnected world.

Empowering Young Americans

Our Christianson Fellowship provides funding to young Americans who are eager to apply their skills and passion through meaningful and sustainable volunteer work abroad, while they themselves increase their intercultural awareness and cultural competency, refine


Expanding Opportunities for Americans Abroad

A positive exchange experience—and the health, safety, and welfare of every participant—has always been, and will always remain, our highest priority. In 2025, InterExchange upheld rigorous standards of support and program quality, ensuring participants felt prepared, welcomed, and cared for at every stage of their journey.

Our dedicated staff provides comprehensive guidance before, during, and after each exchange, offering individualized assistance, 24/7 emergency support, and regular check-ins to ensure participants thrive in their placements and communities. This proactive approach promotes safety, compliance, and confidence in navigating new environments.

Across the U.S., our staff also connect participants and hosts to a wide range of meaningful cultural engagement opportunities. Through volunteer activities, holiday celebrations, sporting events, and group outings, participants immersed themselves in local communities while sharing their own cultures. From sightseeing and community service to

cultural celebrations, these experiences fostered lasting friendships, broadened perspectives, and created memorable, transformative moments for all involved.

BridgeUSA participants consistently reported high satisfaction with their cultural activities, host communities, and overall placements. Likewise, American host families and employers praised participants' professionalism, enthusiasm, and global perspectives—qualities that strengthen communities, enrich workplaces, and build enduring connections.

Exchange Day

For over a decade, InterExchange has been participating in Exchange Day, a cross-program annual celebration of the power of international exchange. In early August 2025, InterExchange staff and participants volunteered at God's Love We Deliver in New York City where they contributed to well over 1,000 medically-tailored meals being packed up for New Yorkers and their families in need. InterExchange also contributed to several Exchange Day events carried out across the country, including a pizza party for exchange visitors in the Wisconsin Dells.

Welcome Events and Community Support Group (CSG) engagement

In 2025, InterExchange supported the vital work of Community Support Groups (CSGs) nationwide, attending welcome events in Ocean City, MD; the Outer Banks, NC; Port Clinton, OH; Bethany Beach, DE; Lake George, NY; and Park City, UT. These events bring together exchange organizations, host employers, and community leaders to warmly welcome BridgeUSA participants, share local resources and safety

guidance, and foster community connections. As part of our safety campaign, InterExchange also distributed free bike lights to help participants stay visible and safe.

2025 Cultural Quest

This annual contest showcases cultural immersion and appreciation as participants become social media content creators, competing to win top recognition and prizes. There was strong interest with over 130 sign-ups and 40 auditions submitted. Ultimately, 16 finalists published over 60 videos, reaching 30,000 Instagram accounts and achieving over 500K views and 4,000 interactions.



Au Pair USA Local Events

Local Coordinators built an incredible community for InterExchange’s au pair participants in 2025. From the high energy of marathons to the cultural depth of the Baltimore Native American Festival, these events perfectly blend service with American immersion. Au pairs and Local Coordinators volunteered at both the L.A. and NYC Marathons, where they helped support runners at both the start and finish

lines, monitored fluid stations, and encouraged runners along the race. In June, Seattle-area au pairs experienced America’s pastime firsthand, attending a Mariners baseball game at T-Mobile Park. Au Pair USA’s Princeton area cluster gathered for a day of giving back to their community where they assembled care bags for babies, children, and teens in the foster care system.

We participated in multiple Community Support Group (CSG) forums and welcome events, as well as industry association events across the U.S., several of which involved the participation of federal representatives and local elected officials.

InterExchange champions the value of international exchange by educating policymakers, community leaders, and stakeholders about the critical benefits of BridgeUSA programs. In 2025, we continued to play a vital role in elevating the visibility and understanding of these initiatives—advocating for policies that reinforce program integrity, broaden accessibility, and ensure long-term sustainability. As a trusted leader in the cultural exchange community, we remain deeply committed to protecting and expanding opportunities that advance U.S. public diplomacy and strengthen global understanding.

Local communities are essential partners in this mission. The Americans who welcome our international participants—host families, employers, coworkers, neighbors, and everyday vacationers—help shape the exchange experience and provide authentic

exposure to U.S. culture, values, and daily life. Their engagement is central to ensuring that participants feel safe, supported, and fully immersed in their communities.

InterExchange continues to partner with stakeholders and civil society institutions nationwide to create environments where meaningful, mutually beneficial cultural exchange can thrive. These volunteer-driven, community-based collaborations foster real-world learning at the grassroots level and directly advance the foreign policy objectives that underpin international exchange programs.

Alliance for International Exchange Advocacy Day

In March 2025, a group of seven InterExchange staff traveled to Washington, DC, to participate in the Alliance for International Exchange's Advocacy Day. During the visit, the team met

with nearly 20 bipartisan congressional offices across both the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate. The InterExchange team also attended a Congressional Reception at the U.S. Capitol Visitor Center to hear from Members of Congress supportive of exchange programs, as well as representatives of the U.S. Department of State. All of these engagements provided a valuable opportunity to connect with fellow exchange organizations and educate Members of Congress and their staff about the critical role BridgeUSA exchange programs play in advancing U.S. foreign policy and strengthening local and national economies.

In September 2025, InterExchange hosted a successful meeting with Congressman Jack Bergman (R, MI-1) in Bellaire, Michigan, to highlight the vital role the Summer Work Travel (SWT) program plays in supporting his district and the state of Michigan. The meeting brought together host employers from local businesses alongside eight SWT participants from Türkiye, Romania, Spain, and Thailand. Participating employers—including Boyne

Mountain Resort, Grand Beach and Sugar Beach Hotel, and Shanty Creek Resort—emphasized the program’s value in meeting peak-season workforce needs while enriching their businesses through international cultural exchange.
